Sacrament Preparation Baptism

Our community rejoices in welcoming children through the Sacrament of Baptism. Please call Linda Rega, 770-977-1442 for info & scheduling.

First Reconciliation & First Eucharist

These sacraments are generally celebrated in the 2nd grade.

Preparation includes two consecutive, completed years of religious education and workshop participation.

Confirmation

This sacrament is generally celebrated in the 10th grade.

Two consecutive, completed years of religious education (8th & 9th) are required. In addition, students must attend a weekend retreat, perform a minimum of 25 hours of service (spread across 8th-10th grades), and complete a journal workbook.

Order of Christian Initiation (OCI) for Children, Teens & Adults

Sunday, 12:30 –1:30 pm (Children & Teens) Sunday, 11:30 am-1:00 pm, (Adults) Mass dismissal, 11 am & 2 pm

For students in grades 3-12 & Adults who have not been baptized OR who have been baptized but have not received formal religious education.
